

# Where and how do refugees get water?

As you may know, refugees are people who are outside their native country or the country they live in. They can't or just don't want to take advantage of the protection of their state or don't want to return there because of fear of persecution. Refugees are part of the wider group of displaced persons. They are distinguished by economic migrants in that the latter voluntarily leave their country for economic reasons. In the world, around 10 countries grant allowances to refugees living in refugee camps, for example. These are usually people who are fleeing war. In recent years, quota has been received by people from Iran, Iraq and the former Yugoslavia. The European Union will allocate around two billion euros to help Syrian refugees. Much of the funds will be invested in the territory of Syria's neighbors. European money will serve to supply water, sanitation, shelter and medicines to refugees in neighboring Syria.

Refugees are therefore supplied with water from wherever we inhabit. The difference is that the means by which the water is harvested is derived from donations.
